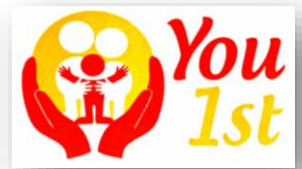

Thursday 15th December – food bank collection

Next Thursday (15th) is our annual Christmas Jumper Day when we collect non-perishable food products (and other products like nappies and pet food) for a local charity which runs a food bank. Your child should bring a food donation up to the value of £1 to £2, if they are able to, to help us support this charity to support some of the most vulnerable families in our community. It is a non-uniform day with a festive theme – jumper, Santa hat etc. If you have nothing festive then something bright and cheerful will be fine!
