

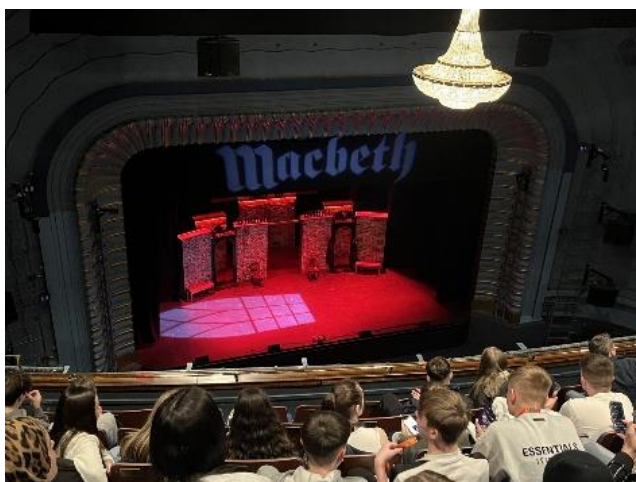

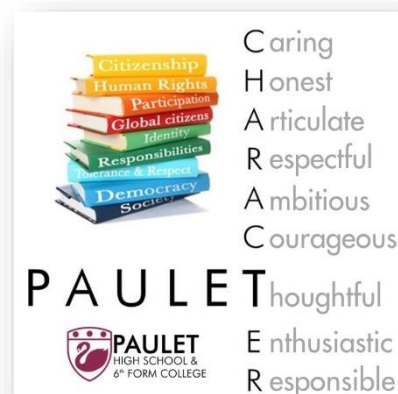
1. **Being equipped for the day** – please ensure your child leaves home with a school bag containing their pencil case and student handbook. Being ill-equipped, having no pen, has a detrimental effect on the start of lessons and it is disrespectful to the teacher, peers and the student him or herself.
2. **Chewing gum** – totally banned. Our carpets need protecting and chewing, often open mouthed, is unpleasant and doesn't help a young person to be ready for adulthood.
3. **Drinks** – students should only be drinking water in a bottle bought from home which is either rigid plastic or aluminium. Shop bought, single use, plastic bottles are not allowed. Although our canteen no longer sells drinks, students have abundant access to chilled water during the day.

4. **Uniform** – No leggings. Only tailored trousers, tailored shorts and tailored skirts allowed. Footwear should be all black, leather or leather look and polishable. Please email shoes@phs.jtmat.co.uk if you need any clarification on specific items.
5. **Jewellery** - only a watch, one ring and one stud or small sleeper in each ear lobe is allowed. No other piercings are acceptable.
6. **And finally** – Paulet Character in all we do!
